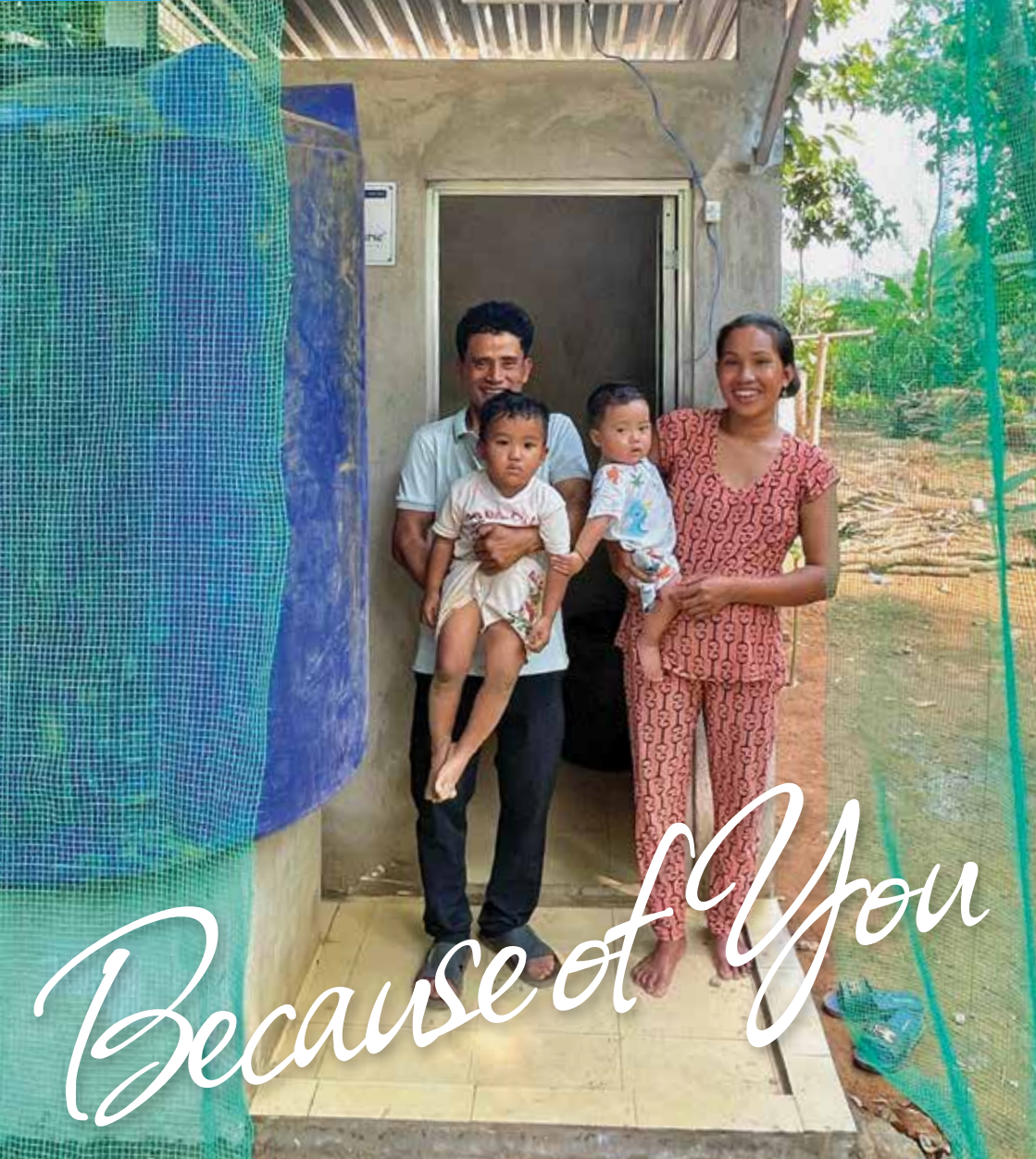

Samaritan's Purse Australia and New Zealand provided clean water sources for thousands of people in Cambodia and Vietnam last year with your support. Our Water For Families (WFF) and Genesis 41 projects provided opportunities to bring both physical relief and hope in the Name of Jesus Christ to individuals, families and entire villages in need.

## GENESIS 41 PROJECT, VIETNAM

TRA VINH PROVINCE IN VIETNAM has been greatly impacted by dry seasons since 2018 and saltwater intrusion. Nearly 3,000 households lacked clean water and required water pipes to connect to the water supply system.

Samaritan's Purse in partnership with the Water Centre, a local government agency, installed pipelines and provided 250 households with access to safe and clean water through the Genesis 41 Project. The Project also provided 100 households with access to 1,000L water storage tanks; 40 houses with sanitary latrines; training for 60 people to reach 1,200 community members with hygiene and sanitation education; and training for 30 people to reach 600 community members with messaging around safe menstrual hygiene.

**THACH THI PHA LY** lives in Tra Vinh and became a beneficiary from the pipeline installation. She will also be receiving a latrine in the new year.

## WATER FOR FAMILIES PROJECT, CAMBODIA

The WFF project provided 2,205 BioSand Water Filters (BSF) to households in Sala Krau districts, Pailin province. Three water distribution networks, and 6 boreholes were drilled providing clean water for families and entire villages.

This project also supported 391 households with subsidised latrines and supported local entrepreneurs in 15 villages to conduct sanitation marketing and build a latrine ring to provide best hygiene practices. This will support approximately 12,040 people!

**MR PHEARUN LOUN\*** lives in Stoeng Trong Commune in west Cambodia with his wife and four children. This commune is home to 656 people living in 136 different households. Within this village there was no access to proper sanitation facilities, and waste was often left exposed putting water at risk. During rainy season as floodwaters rose, the risk of widespread illness and death greatly increased due to the contaminated water.

Samaritan's Purse distributed materials to equip families with supplies to construct latrines. Phearun received his materials and was able to construct a simple latrine with a wooden frame, fabric walls and a concrete ring to sit over a hole. Now, Phearun and his family use the latrine daily rather than going out into the forest. His family has access to safe sanitation and are less susceptible to waterborne illness. In addition, the family were provided with a BioSand water filter and now have access to safe drinking water. *\*Name changed for privacy*
